A. GIPL will offer a solar feasib	pility study/solar assessment for a fee of \$125 per congregation.

C. GIPL will explore and prese	nt options for procurement, leasing, SEPAs, and/or alternative

options for incorporating on-site solar into the energy portfolio of the congregation.

- D. GIPL will provide independent expertise and guidance on what, if any, solar solutions a congregation should consider, and will also serve as a liaison between the selected solar contractor/installer, the leadership of the congregation, and any other appropriate decision-making bodies from the point of initiating the assessment process until the point of installation of a solar PV solution at the congregation, or for as long as the project remains feasible to all parties.
- E. Solar Assessments performed in 2019 or earlier may need to be performed again to ensure that the assessment is as accurate as possible.
- F. GIPL may share the congregation's solar performance data/recommended solar solutions with other congregations in the program.
- G. GIPL will post on its website the congregation's name, assessment date, and a brief summary of the experience of the congregation after successful procurement/implementation of a solar energy system. This helps promote the Solar Wise Program to others and furthers our goals of caring for Creation.

_____ will enter into this agreement and provide the following:

- A. The Congregation will pay a small administrative fee as discussed in A. above.
- B. The Congregation will provide relevant facility information about square footage, congregation size, building use, roof age, plans for building renovations as outlined in the Background Sheet provided by GIPL's Program Director. In addition, a minimum of 13 months of the most recent electric usage is needed to complete the assessment. Scanned bill images emailed to hannah@gipl.org are preferred.
- C. The Congregation will make its buildings and appropriate personnel available to GIPL and our partners during any actual on-site assessments (about 2 hours), when necessary. Appropriate personnel should be familiar with the history of the congregation and buildings in addition to having keys to access all areas.
- D. The Congregation will enter good faith discussions about ways to employ recommended improvements within the constraints of available funds and time so that solar/clean energy solutions and savings can be realized in a reasonable time.
- E. The Congregation will promote solar/clean energy education among its members and alert them to GIPL supported procurement opportunities when they are available in their area.

F. GIPL has also developed a number of educational classes and workshops and practical
climate solution programs related to the 20 high impact solutions from Drawdown Georgia.
Congregations are encouraged to explore additional programs that will help them reduce their
carbon footprint and enhance environmental stewardship on site.
